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### INCOMING FRESHMEN – CLASS OF 2021 – KEY DATES

November, 2016	Junior High will share students' scores on <u>Measure of Academic Progress (MAP) test</u> .
November 12, 2016	8:00 am – 10:20 am <u>Makeup MAP testing at Oak Forest</u> for students that have not completed MAP testing.
November/December	Math and World Language department supervisors will administer <u>Algebra, French, Spanish exams at the feeders schools</u> for students that are currently in Algebra or a World Language. These results will be used for placement in students' freshman schedule.
December 3, 2016	9:00 am – 11:00 am <u>Digital Literacy Proficiency Test at Oak Forest High School</u> Students enrolled in 1 <sup>st</sup> or 2 <sup>nd</sup> quarter computers in grade 8 can pre-register with their Junior High to take test at Oak Forest School. No credit is awarded for a passing score on this exam, but student will meet the graduation requirement for completion of Digital Literacy class.
December/January	Students currently receiving services via an <u>Individual Education Plan (IEP)</u> will meet at their <u>Junior High</u> for an IEP/high school transition meeting. A representative from Oak Forest High School will attend this meeting that will be scheduled through the Junior High. Parents and students will select freshman classes at this meeting and students will <u>not need</u> to meet with counselors on January 23, 24, or 25 dates.
January 12, 2017	4:00 pm – 5:00 pm <u>World Language Make-up Test</u> Students that did not get tested in their feeder schools can take make-up test at <u>Oak Forest High School</u> .
January, 2017	<u>Algebra Make-up Test</u> . (Date and time to be determined.) Students that did not get tested in their feeder schools for the Algebra test can take make-up test at <u>Hillcrest High School</u> .
January 19, 2017	7:00 pm <u>Open House</u> Parents and students are invited to attend an open house at <u>Oak Forest High School</u> . Parents will receive course selection appointments, information packets, and attend presentations by department supervisors to discuss the district curriculum.
January 23, 24, 25	Incoming 8 <sup>th</sup> grade families will <u>meet with Counselors at Oak Forest High School</u> to review placement information and make course selection for the upcoming school year. (Appointment times will be given to students at Open House on January 19 <sup>th</sup> .) Students ID picture will be taken these evenings. <u>Parents will be asked to provide the following information:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Parents State ID or Driver's License</li><li>• 2 proofs of residency (utility bills) with parent/guardian name</li><li>• Mortgage, Lease or Property tax bill with parent/guardian name</li><li>• Students Birth Certificate</li></ul>
April 29, 2017	9:00 am – 11:00 am <u>Digital Literacy Proficiency Test at Oak Forest High School</u> . Students enrolled in 3 <sup>rd</sup> or 4 <sup>th</sup> quarter computers in grade 8 can pre-register with their Junior High to take test at Oak Forest High School. No credit is awarded for a passing score on this exam, but student will meet the graduation requirement for completion of Digital Literacy class.
May 15 – July 20	Make an appointment with your physician for <u>physical/immunizations</u> .
June 2017	<u>Letters will be sent home explaining the Online Registration</u> process that must be used for all students for the 2017/2018 school year.
July 2017	<u>Online Registration</u> must be completed for all students for 2017/2018 school year.
July 20, 2017	<u>Completed physical is due to Oak Forest High School nurse</u> . Freshmen must use the State of Illinois Certificate of Child Health Examination.
Mid August	<u>Registered students will receive passwords &amp; usernames to log into PowerSchool and obtain schedules and lockers</u> . (And bus information if applicable).
